If going out is unavoidable please be prepared in advance with safe driving tips for the winter season.

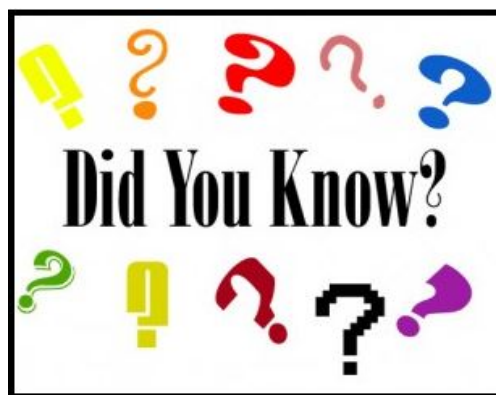
1. Avoid sudden stops and starts
