YOUR DECISIONS DRIVE YOUR SAFETY



The Network of Employers for Traffic Safety (NETS) knows that people killed in traffic crashes are people just like us (moms and dads, daughters and sons, grandparents, aunts and uncles, best friends and colleagues).

New studies are indicating that the root cause of traffic crashes has shifted dramatically in recent years, with driver-related factors such as fatigue, driver error, impairment and distraction present in 94 percent of crashes. In other words, *only 6 out of every 100 crashes are a result of something other than what a driver did or did not do behind the wheel.*

That is why the theme for this year's Drive Safely Work Week™ (DSWW), the annual safe-driving campaign sponsored by NETS, is *Drowsy, Distracted, or Focused... Your Decisions Drive Your Safety.*

The Southwestern Pennsylvania Commission (SPC) hereby gives public notice that it is the policy of the Commission to assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, Executive Order 12898 on Environmental Justice, and related statutes and regulations in all programs and activities. Title VI and other related statutes require that no person in the United States of America shall, on the grounds of race, color, sex, national origin, age, or disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which SPC receives federal financial assistance. Any person who believes they have been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice by SPC under Title VI has a right to file a formal complaint with the Commission. Any such complaint must be in writing and filed with SPC's Title VI Coordinator within one hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the alleged discriminatory occurrence.
